

Why the name Arrowwood; we chose this name from the Southern Arrow-wood plant that is indigenous to the eastern coast of the United States. This versatile plant's common name refers to the Native American use of the strong, straight young stems as arrow shafts. The Native Americans would cut arrow shafts over and over from the same plant, testifying to the plant's hardiness and strong root system. Like this plant, Arrowwood Environmental Group, Inc. is versatile in its capabilities, values strong client relationships and is deeply rooted in its community.

Arrow-wood is a flowering shrub, bearing creamy white flowers in the spring with deeply toothed margins in its dark green leaves.



In fall the Arrow-wood bears colorful fall foliage with dark bluish berries in clusters.

Arrow-wood viburnum shrubs will tolerate a range of soils from dry to fairly wet, but are a good choice for wet areas of the yard. This plant will attract several types of butterflies and provides necessary cover and food for wild bird activity in the yard.
